


The SCA Submission Escutcheon



A common technique for drawing a heraldic escutcheon, shown in red below, is to construct a rectangle which is three times as wide as it is tall, then scribe a pair of quarter circles below it, enclosing the area where they overlap.

The escutcheon on the society's submission forms, shown in black below, is slightly different; the curve starts lower and then pinches in more steeply. Submissions which do not use this precise shape are likely to be rejected.
